GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this survey are located in Douglas County approximately four and one-half miles south of the hamlet of Olalla, Oregon. Access is by way of Olalla Creek County Road No. 38 and numerous other gravel and dirt roads. The area is mountainous with elevations ranging from about 880 feet above sea level near the W 1/16 section corner of section 32 only on the north boundary, to about 2050 feet above sea level at the corner of sections 4, 5, 32, and 33 on the south boundary of the township.

The soil consists of a rocky clay. There were no mineral deposits noted along the lines resurveyed. The timber consists of fir, white fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, yew, white oak, live oak, alder, madrone, maple, and chinkapin. The undergrowth consists of salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, arrowwood, hazel, blackberry, vine maple, and ferns.

The land is used mainly for timber production with various ages of growth.

The average of a number of readings along the lines resurveyed gives a mean magnetic declination of 18¼° East, with no local attractions noted.
