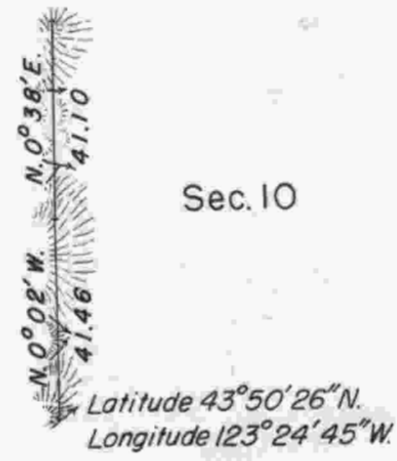


TOWNSHIP N° 20 SOUTH, RANGE N° 6 WEST, OF THE WILLAMETTE MERIDIAN, OREGON.

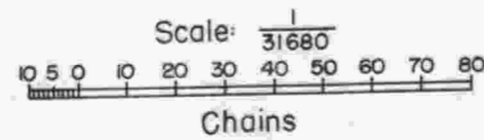
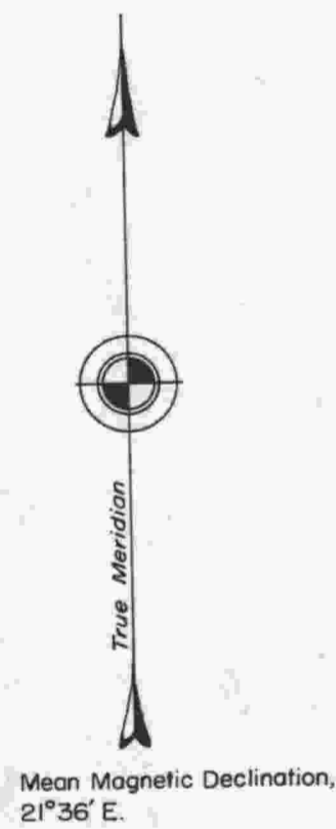

Douglas fir is the predominate species of timber in this area. There is a considerable amount of hemlock, and cedar with scattered maple, alder, chinquapin, madrona, yew, and cascara timber.
