1/4 Corner for Sec. 12 and Sec. 7 of T27-4E  
 Found - 1929 GLO brass cap 4" above ground surfade. Township & range not stamped on brass cap. (T27S on line between R3E & R4E).  
 A 23" Fir stump bears N.16 1/2°W., 48.3 ft. No scribing or face (Stump cut short). (Rec. N.16 1/2°W., 48.18 ft.)  
 A 17" Fir stump bears N.83°E., 38.28 ft. No scribing or face. (Stump cut short, close to ground).  
 New BT's- A 15" D. Fir bears N.85 1/2°E., 51.3 ft. scribed "1/4 S7 CS BT" on a double blaze.  
 A 20" D. Fir bears S.58°W., 84.5 ft. scribed "1/4 S12 CS BT" on a double blaze.  
 County BT tags placed on both.  
 Note: Corner lies 200 ft. West of F.S. Rd. #2734 in a partial cut unit.

CONDITION REPORT ONLY.  
 1/4 Corner for Secs. 21 and 28.  
 Found - A cross (+) in bed rock and a portion of a "4" in the rock just below the cross.  
 Orig. 24" still 24" D. Fir bears S.75°30'W., 46.4 ft. (Rec. 44.88 ft. is to face). Has a healed blaze.  
 A 26" D. Fir (Orig. 24") bears N.61°W., 35.64 ft. Has a healed blaze.  
 Placed County BT signs on both trees. Corner is 5' East of Camas Creek.

1/4 Corner for Secs. 20 and 29.  
 Found - 1929 U.S. GLO brass cap on a 3/4" I. Rod. Rod is set firmly in ground, but badly bent. Brass cap properly stamped.  
 Orig. 12" now 20" Hemlock bears N.1°W., 22.8 ft. (Rec. 23.1 ft.)  
 Has a healed scar.  
 Orig. BT to the SE is gone.  
 Set - Referencing the location of the rod, I remove, straighten and reset the orig. monument and build a rock mound around pipe. I ADD "T27S R3E" to brass cap.  
 New BT - A 19" White Fir bears S.29°W., 41.2 ft. scribed "1/4 S29 CS BT" on a double blaze.
