 Found - W. Fir, now 48", S.25°W. 9.9 ft. Open scar & fd. portions
 of scribing on partly rotted old face.
 Cedar Tree, now 40", N.60°E. 24.4 ft. Opened scar & fd.
 badly rotted old face, old axe mks. found, but no scribing.
 Stump Hole & rotted remains of white Fir Log N.30°W. 26.4 ft.
 Too far gone for scars or scribing.
 Stump Hole S.70°E. 25.1 feet.
 Set - Brass Cap at Cor. Mkd: County Surveyor's T22S R7W

 old face "S" & part of an "R". I reblaze & rescribe this
 tree T22S R7W S24 CS BT. #172
 Rotted Stump & Maple Stool N.25°W. 9.9 ft. No scars or
 scribing found, too badly decayed.
 No trace found of other Original Bearing Trees.
 New BT: 29" D.Fir S.23°E. 13.3 ft. Mkd: T22S R7W S23 & 24 CS BT.
 No good trees near to N.W.
 DID NOT SET BRASS CAP.

Renew Corner to Sections S33/S34: T21S R7W. 126
 Found - Haines' "T" Iron & Cap at Corner - Maple, now 24", N.33°E. (See Ren.#12 IN T.21-7)
 25.1 ft., reverse scribing visible on wood grown against
 old face, tree hollow and one side rotted away.
 White Fir, now 40", N.60°W. 18.5 ft., hollow & S.E. side rotted
 away, no scribing seen.
 No trace of Fir Bearing Tree to S. E.
 Remnant of Cedar Stump S. 9°W. 32.3 feet., apparently one of
 Wheeler's Trees, 1883 survey.
 New BT's: 31" D.Fir N.20°W. 38.5 ft. Mkd: T21S R7W S33 CS BT.
 16" D.Fir N.54°E. 66.9 ft. Mkd: T21S R7W S34 CS BT.

Closing Corner to Sections 4 and 3, 127
 S 4/S 3
 Found - Haines' "T" Iron & Cap - Fir, now 64", S.20°E. 37.6 ft., cut
 open & found good scribing "S" on old face. REN.#42
 Dogwood, down & badly rotted, S.42°W. 41.6 ft. Found burl wood
 but center rotted away. No scribing or old face found. #171
 Blaze & Rescribe (in wood) 64" B.Fir S.20°E. 37.6 ft. Mkd: T22SR7W CC S3 CS BT.
 New BT: 12" Red Cedar S.17°W. 41.8 ft. Mkd: T22S R7W S 4 CC CS BT.

Section Corner to Sections 13 - 14 - 23 - 24. 128
 Found - Haines' "T" Iron at Corner - Fir, now 60", N.48°E. 9.2 ft.,
 to center, old bark scribing visible "S T S" & portions of
 other letters or numbers, rescribed in bark by Haines,
 T22S R7W S13 363 BT.
 No trace of other Orig. Bearing Trees.
 16" D.Fir scribed by Haines bears S.75°W. 18.0 ft., scribe pitched over.
 New BT's: 13" D.Fir N.78°W. 24.1 ft. Mkd: T22S R7W S14 CS BT.
 20" D.Fir S.15°E. 12.5 ft. Mkd: T22S R7W S24 CS BT.

¼ Corner to Sections 23 and 24. 129
 Found - Haines' "T" Iron - I. Cedar, now 14", S.55°W. 4.0 ft., showed
 very good scars. Cut open lower scar & found good scribing "B",
 rings show tree has grown very slowly, scribing is old enough
 for Original. I reblaze & scribe this tree, "¼ S23 CS BT".
 No trace found of Original N.E. Bearing Tree.
 New BT: 5" D.Fir N.32°E. 17.7 ft. Mkd: ¼ S24 CS BT.
 Corner lies on steep East Slope - Old scribing faces S.E. instead of N.E.
