Section corner for Secs. 18 and 19  
And Secs. 13 and 24 of T.26-4  
Found - A 1966 County brass cap on a 1" x 36" I.P. properly stamped.  
A 1" I. Pipe 3 ft. above ground in a mound of stone.  
Pipe and stone referenced by R. W. Fenn, C.E. See. Ren. #174  
Pipe is South of cap .1 ft.  
An Orig. 15" Myrtle, now a very rotted stump bears S.43°W.,  
8.6 ft.  
An Orig. 6" Myrtle bears N.73°W., 17.8 ft. This tree is gone but  
a clump of new growth Myrtle is at the position.  
No other orig. trees.  
A 13" Myrtle now 14" with healed over double blaze bears  
S.88°E., 45.5 ft. (Rec. N.82°E.) Tree is in a clump of  
three.  
An 8" Myrtle now an 11" with a partially healed blaze bears  
S.50°E., 34.9 ft. (Rec. S.60°E. No visible scribe.  
A 7" Myrtle with partially healed double blaze with visible  
scribe "T26S R4W S4 C" in a clump of nine trees (Rec. seven)  
bears S.74°W., 29.0 ft. (Rec. S.70°W.)  
A 7" Myrtle with partially healed double blaze no visible scribe  
bears N.73°W., 12 ft.  
Above 4 trees are from Ren. #174.  
Left cap and pipe in place. Tagged BTs.

1/4 Corner for Sections 33 and 34.  
Found - 1966 County brass cap properly marked, on iron pipe. Cap protruding  
0.4 ft. above ground and large stones. Ren. #151  
Original monument not found.  
An orig. 28" Incense cedar, now 57" with previously chopped out  
blaze visible scribe "1/4S" bears N.78°E., 103.0 ft.  
Orig. NW Laurel gone.  
A 14" Incense Cedar, now a 16" x 4.5 ft. stump, with unhealed  
blaze visible scribe "1/4 S33 CS BT" bears N.11°W., 22.2 ft.  
A 12" D. Fir, now 14" with well healed double blaze bears N.23°E.,  
49.6 ft. (Rec. 50.7 ft.). Put new tag on this tree.  
No new monument set.  
New BT's- A 10" D. Fir scribed "1/4 S34 CS BT" in a double blaze bears  
S.20°E., 108.1 ft. Tagged with BT tag.  
A 20" Incense Cedar scribed "1/4 S33 CS BT" in a double blaze  
bears S.76°W., 32.7 ft. tagged with BT tag.  
Corner lies on NE slope 12 ft. S of fence remnants Course E-W.

Found - 1" I.P. firmly set 4" above ground with a 1916 US GLO brass cap  
properly marked.  
A 43" D. Fir snag, with no scribing visible on rotted balze b  
N.63°W., 35.6 ft.  
A Protruding point of bluff with no orig. chisel marks visible  
remarked "X B0" bears S.59°W., 3.7 ft. (Rec. S.51°W., 4.0  
A 4" x 4" X is at the exact bearing point.  
New BT's- A 10" Hemlock bears N.13°W., 16.9 ft. scribed "X BT" on a  
double blaze with brass washer stamped "LS 397" nailed into  
lower blaze.
