A 2" Chiseled +, 5 ft. above ground on the north face of the second bridge pier east of the NW corner of the Washington Street Bridge, bears S.25°W., 15.22 ft.

In conjunction with the above references:

We find a 3/4" I.Pin with 1 1/4" I.P. alongside noted in CS 52/59 as being N.89°52'W., 452.13 ft. from the SE corner DLC 56, T27S R6W; from which a 20" now 24" B.Oak bears N.2°W., 28.4 ft., alive and well-healed. This BT will be removed and the area covered with fill material.

We reference the pin as follows:

A 5/8" I.Rod reset at "RP-C" (As orig. monumented by Woodford, See M4-11), bears S.83°W., 55/21 ft.

Southwest Corner DLC #56

Found - 1" I.P. set flush in the ground in the South ditch line of W. Military Ave. at southerly end of W. Umpqua St. with brass cap attached: County Surveyors Office SW Ren. #33

A 28" now 32" W. Oak, alive with no visible marks or scars bears N.57°E., 112.0 ft. to face, (Rec. N.60°07'E., 112.0 ft.).

An Iron pin, N.20°W., 34.15 ft. was not found.

No other evidence found.

We note the following bearing objects:

A 4" "X" chiseled in the top of the easterly curb of W. Umpqua St. 1.5 ft. North of the South end of the curb, bears N.29 1/2°E., 53.38 ft.

A 4" "X" chiseled on top of the Westerly curb of W. Umpqua St. 1.5 ft North of the South end of the curb, bears N.11 1/2°W., 39.09 ft.

We place a steel fencepost with survey marker witness sign SE 1.2 ft. from the corner.

Northwest corner DLC #64

Found - 5/8" x 30" Iron rod in mound of stone. Ren. #34

An Oak stump, 15" now 26" bears N.48°W., 15.8 ft. with blaze but center rotted and burned.

An Oak stump, 20" now 42" bears N.55°E., 36.3 ft. with possible healed blaze, center rotted away. Location of third BT is in relocated highway.

Set - Brass cap on 1" x 30" I.P. in mound of stone 30" dia. 2.0 ft. high. marked: "County Surveyors Office"

New BT's - A 14" Black Oak, bears S.4°E., 87.0 ft. double blazed and scribed "DLC 64 T27S R6W CS BT"

Note: Corner is on North bank of Melrose Rd. at #955 mailbox.

Found - 5/8" x 33" Iron rod (Rec. 5/8" x 36") on N-S fence line and remains of wire fence to west. Ren. #60

A 16" now 20" W. Oak bears N.86°W., 13.2 ft. (Rec. West) with well healed double blaze.

A 12" now 14" Myrtle bears N.46°W., 27.3 ft. with partially healed double blaze and scribe marks visible.
