Renewed from old Gov. B.T.s. Set  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" Galv. Iron Pipe from which  
All old Gov. trees, remarked, still stand except the Black Oak

SEE CORNER NO. 63

CORNER BETWEEN 33 and 4 on TP. LINE ON N. BDY OF 28-4  
Renewed from old Gov. B.T. Set in  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 48" Galv. Iron Pipe from which the following trees bear  
A 14" Fir bears N.42 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 1.83 chs.  
A 14" Fir bears N.32 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 1.065 chs.

SEE CORNER NO. 94

CORNER OF SECTIONS 33, 34, 3 and 4 on N. BDY. OF 28-4  
Renewed from old B.T.s. Set in  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 36" Galv. Iron Pipe from which  
All old Gov. trees, remarked, still stand.

S.E. CORNER OF D.L.C. # 37  
Renewed from old Bearing Tree. Set in  $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 36" Galv. Iron Pipe from which  
Old Gov. White Oak, remarked still stands.

N.E. CORNER OF D.L.C.

CORNER SECTIONS 33, 34, 3 and 4 on TP. LINE ON S. BOUNDARY OF 28-4

Found a scribbled stake: all B.T.s gone except Maple stump N.80°E., 7.25 chs. Set  $\frac{1}{2}$ " Iron pipe for corner. Marked the following trees  
A Fir 30" dia. bears S.34°E., 47.0 ft.  
A Fir 48" dia. bears S.68°W., 17.0 ft.  
No other trees available.

CORNER BETWEEN 33 and 4 ON SOUTH BOUNDARY OF T.28  
Found a stump that had evidence of blaze. Albert Robinson said that years ago some marks were visible. Set  $\frac{5}{8}$ " Iron pipe for corner from this stump and marked the following trees  
Fir 14" dia. bears N.26°E., 4.2 ft.  
Fir 10" dia. bears S.30°W., 33 ft.

SEE CORNER NO. 81

CORNER BETWEEN 33 and 34.  
Set 1" Iron Pipe for corner at location in fence corner pointed out by Albert Robinson, who saw corner set in 1881. All B.T.s gone. Marked the following trees  
Fir 24" dia. bears N.64°W., 226.0 ft.  
Maple 12" dia. bears N.6°30'W., 101 ft.  
(No other B.T. suitable)

SEE CORNER NO. 45

CORNER COMMON TO 27, 28, 33 and 34.  
Set  $\frac{3}{4}$ " Iron Pipe from original B.T.s standing. Set squared wood marker by pipe.

SEE CORNER NO. 50

CORNER BETWEEN 28 and 33.  
Found a 44" Fir that had blaze mark in bark but had been burned badly, 20 ft. South was stump hole of small tree. I measured to top of hill from this tree and it was 450+ ft. so I assumed the tree to be an Original B.T. Set a 1" Iron Pipe for corner and marked the following trees  
Fir 44" dia. bears N.30°E., 14.0 ft.  
White Fir 24" dia. bears S.28 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 73.0 ft.

CORNER BETWEEN 27 and 34.  
Location pointed out by Albert Robinson. B.T.s gone but we found evidence of old blaze on a down fir. I set Iron Pipe, from this down B.T. with Fir marked by it. I marked the following trees  
Fir 30" dia. bears N.68°E. 20.2 ft.  
Laurel 24" dia. bears S.13°W., 46.0 ft.
