AKA. AP 3 Tr 51 and AP 2 Tr 52, T29-7
Found - 1924 GLO brass cap 6" above ground properly marked.
A 8", now 13" Fir, bears N.12°E., 32.3 ft. with healed blaze.
A 7" Cedar, down and rotted at orig. bearing and dist..(S.60°E.,
4.0 ft.) Scribing found "AP 2 Tr 52 BT" (Rec. "AP 3 Tr 51 BT".)
New BT - A 6" Cedar bears S.70°E., 2.4 ft. scribed "AP 2 Tr 52 CS BT" in
double blaze.

West 1/16, Secs. 7 and 18.
AP 1 Tr 49.
Found - 1924 GLO brass cap on 1" I.P. firmly set extending 8" above
ground properly marked.

From which:

An Orig. 7" now 18" D. Fir alive and well healed bears S.44°W.,
25.7 ft.

New BT - A 7" G. Fir bears S.38 1/2°E., 50.4 ft. scribed "W 1/16 S18
CS BT" on a double blaze.

West 1/16 Secs. 17 and 20.
Found - A 5/8" I. Rod firmly set at 1/16 Cor as determined by
Bruce Rogers in 1964. See M 28- 69

From which:

A Cedar, 12" now 16" bears N.85°W., 33.0 ft. Tree has a well
healed blaze.

An Alder 8" now a 14" stump (8 feet high) bears S.6°W., 23.0 ft.
Stump badly broken, partially decayed.

East 1/16 Cor. for Secs. 17 and 20.
Found - 5/8 " I. Rod at 1/16 corner firmly set as determined by Bruce
Rogers in 1964. See M 28 - 69

From Which:

A Madrone 4 feet, bears N.27°W., 16.5 ft. Tree has open blaze
with axe scribed "X". Tree is alive, major portion of trunk
burnt out by fire.

An Oak 8" now 9" bears S.67°E., 18.0 ft. (Rec. 18.5 ft.)
Tree has healed double blaze.

An Oak 24" now 27" bears S.35°W., 16.5 ft. Tree has partially
healed double blaze with partial scribe marks visible.

West 1/16 for Secs. 18 and 19. AP 4 Tr 52.
Found - 1924 GLO brass cap properly stamped 27" above ground.
Remains of rotten Oak, size indererminate, dislodged and laying
downhill from orig. position. The base of the trunk bears
N.36 1/2°W., 27.7 ft. (Rec. N.44°W.) No scribing found.

Renewal:

As cap is 27" above ground, I reference positon of monument and
relocate it 4" above ground at the exact point where found
and referenced.

New BT's-A 17" D. Fir, bears S.32 1/2°W., 21.9 ft. Tree double blazed
and scribed "W 1/16 S19 CS BT".

A 12" D. Fir bears N.4 1/2°W., 48.1 ft. Tree double blazed and
scribed "AP 4 Tr 52 CS BT".

AP 3 Tr 52, in Sec. 18, T29S R7W.
Found - 1924 brass cap on 1" I.P. extending 12" above ground properly mkd.
From Which:

The only remaining orig. BT, an Orig. 6" now 36" D. Fir, alive
with no apparent scar, bears N.22°W., 29.7 ft.

And a 1924 BT, a 14" now 24" D. Fir, alive and well-healed, bears
N.19°E., 25.1 ft. (Rec. N.17 1/2°E., 25.1 ft.)
