**SEE CORNER NO. 59**  
CORNER OF SECTIONS 20, 21, 28 and 29. 1  
Renewed this corner from the Original Fir Bearing trees also Cedar line tree North 25 lks., the stump of which still existed. I set a Cedar Post 4" x 4" x 36" from which original Fir bearing scribe marks N.22°E., 50 lks. Original Fir, did not open, S.27°E., 48 lks.  
Marked new trees  
A 26" Fir S.49°15'W., 41.0 ft.  
A 30" Chincapin S.66°E., 47.0 ft.

CORNER TO SECTIONS 19, 20, 29 and 30. 2  
Set Iron Pipe 1 1/2" x 36", 16" below surface of ground from which  
Pine tree 24" dia. (IN S.E. corner of Cemetery) N.32°E., 537.0 ft.  
A Pear tree 10" dia. N.31°30'W., 164.6 ft.  
A Fir tree 20" dia. S.41°45'E., 730.0 ft.  
An Iron Pipe 1 1/2" x 40" N.89°07'E., 453.0 ft. on Section line and west boundary of Highway to Coast.

**RENEWED SEE CORNER NO. 121**  
CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 20 and 29. 3  
Set a steel mower plowman from which  
A Fir 18" in dia. S.77°20'E., 741.3 ft.  
A Sugar Pine 26" in dia. N.62°40'E., 150.0 ft.  
No evidence of original corner to be found. This corner was set by proportionate measure.

**SEE CORNER NO. 97**  
CORNER TO SECTIONS 29 and 30, 31 and 32. 4  
I renewed this corner from the original bearing trees and set a Pitch limb post 3" x 3" x 36" also an Iron Pipe 1 1/2" x 30" from which, Original B.T.  
A Fir 20" dead, standing, bearing scribe marks bears N.60°W., 48 lks.  
A 15" Oak nearly dead showing scribe marks bears N.77°E., 106 lks.  
A Fir 30" dia. showing scars bears S.8°W., 155.5 ft. or 175 lks.  
Marked new trees  
A Fir 18" in dia. S.49°30'E., 29.0 ft.  
A Fir 30" in dia. N.60°30'W., 53.0 ft.  
(SAME AS # 83)

S.E. CORNER OF D.L.C. # 43. 5  
This corner was renewed from the original B.T., a White Oak 14" dia. N.11°W., 59 lks. Tree had been opened previously and scribe marks had rotted off. Line trees called for in the Government field notes both North and West at proper distances. I set an Iron Pipe 1 1/2" x 36" from which  
A Fir 40" dia. bears S.50°E., 26.7 ft.  
A Fir 48" dia. bears N.43°30'E., 69.9 ft.  
**SEE CORNER NO. 92**

S.W. CORNER OF D.L.C. # 43. 6  
This corner was renewed from line trees called for in Government field notes, East of the corner and on the South boundary of Claim. I set an Iron Pipe 1 1/2" x 36" from which  
A Maple 12" dia. N.00°20'W., 55.4 ft.  
A Maple 10" dia. N.32°15'E., 73.5 ft.  
No evidence of bearing tree found.

S.E. CORNER OF D.L.C. # 44. 7  
This corner was renewed from the original B.T. which was a White Oak instead of White Ash as called in the field notes. I set an Iron Pipe 1 1/2" x 36" in dia. from which  
White Oak 14" in dia. N.70°W., 83 lks.  
A Fir line tree called fro in field notes bears west 267.3 ft.
