1/4 Corner for Secs. 13 and 24.

Found - 1924 GLO brass cap good condition, firmly set properly marked.

Accessories Orig. Survey:

A Fir, 24" now a badly decayed stump, 30" approx. 10 feet high. I open and find good scribing "BT". Tree bears S.59°E., 7.9 ft. to face (Rec.) and 8.4 ft. to center.

A Fir, 24" now a badly decayed stump 28", 8 ft. high. Tree has old blaze. We do not open. Tree bears N.28°W., 11.2 ft. to center.

Accessories per 1924 Resurvey:

A 30" Fir, now a badly decayed stump, diameter of remaining heart wood 14", 10 feet high. Tree has partially healed blaze, fragmentary scribing visible, bears S.53°W., 17.8 ft.

A 36" Fir, now a 33" stump, 4 feet high. Scribing visible "S13 BT" Stump bears N.73°W., 37.3 ft. to center (Rec. 38.9 ft.)

Accessories per Ren. #151:

A 11" D. Fir now 13", bears N.83°W., 19.8 ft. (Rec. 20.9 ft.) Tree has partially healed double blaze, some scribing visible "3 CS BT".

A 8" now 9" D. Fir bears S.60°W., 17.6 ft. Tree has partially healed double blaze. scribed "B" visible.

A 5" now 6" D. Fir bears S.88°E., 12.6 ft. to center. Tree has partially healed blaze scribing partially covered.

Section Corner for Secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14.

Found - 1924 GLO brass cap 4" above ground firmly in place properly mkd. Orig. 36" Pine now uprooted and badly decayed bears N.54°W., 20.5 ft. to center of root hole. No scribing found.

No other Orig. BT's found.

A Fir, 12" (Per 1924 survey) now 15" bears S.82°E., 13.2 ft. Tree has well healed single blaze.

A Fir, 10" now 20" bears S.66°W., 4.6 ft. Tree has well healed blaze.

A 7" Fir, (1924) now a 10" snag 10 feet high bears N.33°W. (to center at top of blaze) 9.2 ft. Center of base of snag bears N.28 1/2°W., Snag has well healed blaze.

NE BT is gone.

BT's per 1966 renewal. Ren. #123

A 9" D. Fir now 15" stump bears N.42 1/2°E., 16.5 ft. bottom of blaze remaining on stump partially healed scribed "2 CS BT".

A 9" Fir now uprooted bears N.72°W., 15.9 ft. Tree blazed some scribe marks visible, we do not open blaze.

New BT's- A Fir 15" bears N.44°W., 64.9 ft. Tree double blazed and scribed "T29S R8W S11 CS BT"

A Madrone 40" bears N.25°E., 48.1 ft. Tree double blazed and scribed "T29S R8W S12 CS BT"

Note - This corner lies at the corner of clearcuts to the northeast and southwest.

C W 1/16 C Sec. 13.

Found - a 2 1/2" I.P. firmly set extending 8" above ground with standard BLM brass cap attached marked: C W 1/16 C 1975  
(Unrecorded 1975 BLM Survey) S 13

Also; an unrecorded 1" I.P. extending 12" above ground bears S.71°E., 2.4 ft. from the brass cap.

From unofficial 1975 survey:

A 6" now 8" Grand Fir with scribing "CW 1/16 S13 BT" visible on unhealed double blaze bears S.16°E., 11.9 ft. (Rec. per CS file 58/82 S.13°E., 11.9 ft.).

A 20" now 20" Grand Fir, with scribing "CW 1/16 S13 BT" visible on unhealed single blaze bears N.61 1/2°W., 26.4 ft. (Rec. per CS file 58/82, N.59°W., 26.4 ft.)
