1/4 Corner for Section 6 & Section 31 of T. 28-8. 215  
Found - 3 1/2" B.L.M. Brass cap (1964, properly marked) on a 2 1/2" O.D. iron  
pipe protruding 3" above ground.  
Accessories Found -  
6" now 17" dia. D. Fir with a fully healed single blaze, bears  
S. 50 3/4°W., 109.4  
16" now 24" dia. D. Fir with a fully healed blaze bears  
N.50 3/4°E., 88.4 ft. (rec. N.49 3/4°E., 88.4 ft. 1964 BLM).  
3/4" O.D. iron pipe flush with ground, bears S.6 3/4°E., 6.6 ft.  
(agrees with rec.)(C.S. 23/47?). Remnants of old fence from  
west coming into I.P.  
No original B.T.s found.  
Iron bar 6 ft. west of cor. (C.S. 23/47) not found.  
New Accessories -  
8" dia. W. Fir double blazed and scribed "1/4 S6 CS BT" bears  
S.72°E., 41.0 ft.

Section Corner for Sec. 18 & 19; and 13 & 24 of T.29S R9W 216  
Found - Original & stone monument from Ren. # 13 (T29-9) NOT found.  
Magnetic evidence indicates boat spike in asphalt roadway  
from Ren. #65 is in place but is now buried below surface  
shallowly.  
All bearings & distances measured from above mentioned monument:  
No evidence of 2 rocks from Ren. #13 (T29-9) found. West rock  
would fall under roadway & east rock not dug for, in order  
to not disturb brass cap & I.P. from REN. # 194.  
No evidence of witness corner from Ren. #65 found.  
A 16" Oak now a 20" diameter breast high White Oak w/fully  
healed dbl. blaze, in a tight group of nine oaks, now all  
fallen & soon to be removed, bears S.43 1/2°E., 304.8 ft as  
per Ren. # 194.  
From Ren. #194 a brass cap/I.P. bearing object (erroneously  
called a witness corner), a bearing tree, & a power pole  
bearing object are all found.  
A 2 1/2" diameter brass cap marked "Douglas County Surveyor" on  
a 1 1/2" outside diameter I.P. is firmly set, protruding 8"  
above ground & bears East, 16.0 ft. (as per Rec.) A survey  
marker sign bears 1 1/2' East from brass cap monument.  
A 48" now 52" diameter breast high Cedar w/fully healed single  
blaze bears S.88 1/2°W., 498.7 ft. (Rec. S.89°W., 496.9 ft. to  
face)  
A power pole # 1C 17 11 bears N.12 1/2°W., 113.5 ft. (Rec. N.11 1/2°  
W., 114.5 ft., probably to older power pole. Found power  
pole appears new).  
New Accessories:  
An 18" diameter breast high Maple scribed "X BT" on a dbl.  
blaze bears N.05°E., 407.6 ft.  
A 32" diameter breast high White Oak scribed "T29S R8W S19  
CS BT" on a dbl. blaze bears S.34 1/2°E., 709.8 ft.  
Monument is near center of northbound lane of Westside Rd. (Co. Rd.#129)  
in Camas Valley just South from curve in road where direction changes  
from east-west to north-south direction.

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
