Set - ..protruding 9" out of ground, marked: Douglas County  
Surveyor CC T30S R2W S31 T31S R3W S1 1981  
New accessories - Set PK nail, & scribed BT in base of orig. 30" now  
36" Fir on downhill side of tree, bears S.39 1/2° W., 37.1-ft.  
to nail.  
Set PK nail, & scribed BT in base of Orig. 10" now 21" Hemlock  
on downhill side of tree bears N17°W., 21.8-ft. to nail.  
Set PK nail, & scribed BT in base of 32" Fir on downhill side  
of tree bears N81°W., 31.0-ft. to nail.  
Set PK nail, & scribed BT in base of 12" Hemlock on downhill  
side of tree, bears S19°E., 20.8-ft. to nail.  
Note - All of the BT's for this corner will be cut in future timber sale.

South 1/4 corner of Sec. 31. ONLY  
Found - Orig. 15" x 12" x 6" now 14" x 11" x 6" stone with a 1/4 marked  
on North face, buried with top flush to ground.  
BT's - Orig. 15" now 22" Fir snag, 20-ft high with good scar, bears  
N.12°W., 7.9-ft. (rec. N18°W).  
Possible orig. 6" Fir down & rotted at approx. orig. position  
(unable to define root hole).  
Set - At the exact location of the orig. stone, I set a B.C. marked:  
Douglas Co. Surveyor T30S 1/4 S31 R2W 1981 (orig. stone  
buried along North edge of cap).  
New BT's- 30" Fir scribed S1/4 31 CSBT in dble. blaze, bears N87 1/2° E.,  
35.4-ft.  
10" Fir scribed S1/4 6 CSBT in dble. blaze, bears S.69° E., 42.8ft.  
8" Madrone scribed S 1/4 6 CSBT in dble. blaze bears S. 14°W.,  
21.0-ft.  
42" Madrone, w/PK nail in base, scribed S 1/4 6 CSBT in dble blaze,  
bears S67°W., 2.9-ft. to nail.  
Note - This corner is along the Southerly side of a future clear-cut

CC corner for Sec. 31; and Sec. 6 of T.31-2  
Found - Post obliterated.  
Scribing plainly visible, Laurel 15", S. 52°E., 27.7 ft.  
Evidence of fir stump, N. 52 1/2° E., 19.8 ft  
Metal tag, N.20°W., 8 ft.  
5/25/55

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CC corner for Sec. 31; and Sec. 6 of T.31-2  
Found - 2" x 2" fir post 24" long with nail in top, lying in approx.  
vicinity of corner. (Probably from Rsb. Lbr. survey) Ren. #238  
Original post gone.  
Probable remains of orig. 24" fir now 28" rotted stump flush  
with ground.  
Metal tag nailed on slab of bark lying at base of rotted 40"  
fir snag approx. 3 ft. tall, per Rsb. Lbr. survey.  
I could not find any sign of orig. 6" madrone which was seen in 1955 with  
scribing visible. Several small madrones are growing in the vicinity of  
orig. madrone BT but I do not feel any of them are the BT.  
Set - Using the 24" fir stump I believe to be the orig. fir BT and using  
bearing & dist. mentioned in the 1955 Rsb. Lbr. survey  
(S. 52 1/2°W., 19.8 ft.) (Orig. 21.1 ft.) I SET a 1" x 30" I.P.  
with brass cap attached marked: Douglas Co. Surveyor CC S31  
S6 R2W T30S T31S 1981.  
Metal tag & tree per Rsb. Lbr. survey was used only as a rough check. Rec.  
stated N.20°W., 8 ft. I find center of tree 8 ft., face of tree 6.2 ft. and  
bearing to center of base of tree N.2°W. The way the tree seemed to be leaning  
when alive could have had a bearing of N.20°W. to the tag itself if it were  
6 ft. high.  
New BT's- 13" fir scribed "T30S R2W S31 CS BT" in double blaze bears  
N.10°E., 21.4 ft.  
11" Fir scribed "T30S R2W S31 CS BT" in double blaze bears  
N.26°E., 29.8 ft.  
9" Chinquapin scribed "T31S R2W S6 CS BT" in double blaze  
bears S.89°E., 26.4 ft.  
10" Chinquapin scribed "T31S R2W S6 CS BT" in double blaze  
bears S16°E., 11.7 ft.
