N.W. CORNER OF F. O. WORLEY D.L.C. NO. 49.
I found an old stake properly marked but which did not
exactly correspond with calls of the Bearing tree. I
set the corner to correspond to the calls of the Original
B.T. which was standing. The scars having been cut open
were rotted out. I marked new trees
A Black Oak 18" dia. S. 10° E., 16.5 ft.
A Fir 12" dia. S. 65° W., 6.5 ft.
I set a Gal. Iron Pipe $1\frac{1}{2}$ " dia. 40" long 36" in the
ground at corner.

S.W. CORNER OF F. O. WORLEY D.L.C. 49.
I renewed this corner from a White Oak P.O. which I
chopped open and found the scribbles. I ran S. W.
104 lks. and dug over with axes in search of marked
rock. This could not be found. I set a blue River
Boulder 5" x 4" x 12" shaped like a Flat Iron on top and
marked with X 12" below surface of ground. I marked
New B.T.
A Double White Oak 12" dia. S. 69° W., 15.2 ft.
