Corner #4 - Yellow King No 2 Mineral Survey.
Found - A 12" now 22" Fir stump, has been uprooted and pushed to roadside by mining road construction, with cut open blaze and visible scribing "P4YK No.2 4 - 792", orig. location not determined.
A 30" now 35" D. Fir bears S.71 1/2°W. 127.3 ft. with a well healed single blaze.
Set - A 1" x 36" I.P. with brass cap set 10" above ground marked:
"Douglas County Surveyor" T 32 S R 2 W
1977 Y.K. No.2-4 | B.S. 2
S.P. 4
New BT - A 19" D. Fir bears N.19°W., 22.2 ft. double blazed and marked "SP 4 YK No.2-4 BS 2 792 CS BT".
Corner is 25 ft. East of mining road.

Corner #4 - Mountain Top No. 1 - Mineral Survey.
Found - A 28" now 36" Fir stump bears N.73 1/2°E., (Rec. N.74°21'E.) 35.5 ft. with partly healed blaze and visible scribing "No. 1 - MT No. 2 - 792".
A 32" Fir stump bears S.34 1/2°E., 8.4 ft. with scribing visible in unhealed blaze "MT No. 1-4 MT No. 2-4 792".
Set - A 1" x 36" I.P. with brass cap set 4" above ground marked:
"Douglas County Surveyor" T 32 S R 2 W
1977 S.P. 2 | M.T. No.1-4
T.B 2 | M.T. No.2-4
New BT's- A 8" Madrone bears S.68°E., 12.2 ft.
A 6" D. Fir bears N.1°E., 15.5 ft.
Both trees are double blazed and marked "TB 2 SP 2 MT No.1-4 MT No. 2-4 792 CS BT".

Corner #1 - Yellow King No. 1 Mineral Survey.
Found - A 18" now 28" Fir stump bears N.87 1/4°E., 56.9 ft. with healed blaze cut open to show scribing "BT 792".
Set - A 1" x 36" I.P. with brass cap set 10" above ground marked:
"Douglas County Surveyor" T 32 S R 2 W
1977 Y.K.No.1-1 | Tom Boy 4
M.Q. No.1-2
New BT's- A 12" Madrone bears S.66°E., 19.0 ft. bark scribed "TB 4 MQ 2 YK No.1-1 792 CS BT".
A 6" Madrone bears S.2°W., 9.3 ft. bark scribed "TB 4 MQ 2 YK No.1-1 792 CS BT"
Corner is + 30 ft. N.E. of mining road.

Corner # 1 - Tom Boy - Mineral Survey.
Found - A 10" now 15" Madrone bears N.89°E., 18.5 ft. north face of tree is split off. Remainder of blaze is partially healed with visible scribing "BT".
A 15" now 16" Madrone bears S.72°E., 26.1 ft. with a partially healed, rotted out blaze. North half and top of tree is dead.
Set - A 1" x 36" I.P. with brass cap 6" above ground marked:
"Douglas County Surveyor" T 32 S R 2 W
1977 T.B. 1 | M.T. No.2-1
M.Q. No.1-1
New VT - A 6" Madrone bears N.26 1/2°W., 38.3 ft. bark scribed "TB 1 MQ 1 MT No.2-1 792 CS BT".
Note - From the point that the mining road first reaches the ridge, the corner bears S.W. +150 ft.

Corner #2 - Mountain Top No. 1 Mineral Survey.
Found - A 14" now 33" Incense Cedar bears N.9°W. (Rec.N.10°53'W) 49.0 ft. with faint visible scar.
A 15" now 27" D.Fir bears S.40°W. (Rec.S.41°05'W) 40.0 ft. chopped into well healed blaze enough to see scribe marks.
Set - A 1" x 36" I.P. with brass cap set 11" above ground marked:
"Douglas County Surveyor" T 32 S R 2 W
1977 M.T. No. 1-2
No new accessories. Corner is 55 ft. south of mining road.
