SUBJECT: Lost Corner

While pursuing our duties, at Camas Valley, Oregon, we found the East $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 25, T29S, R9W. The bearing trees were gone, so we set witness trees as follows;

A 26" oak bears S66 $\frac{1}{2}$ E, 372.2 to center of tree. This oak is 7 ft. west of the Middle Fork of the Coquille River. Seven feet west of the right bank.

A 4" aspen bears S23 $\frac{3}{4}$ W., 6.3 ft.
The corner is a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " iron pipe flush with the ground.
Both trees are scribed $\frac{1}{2}$ " W.T.
