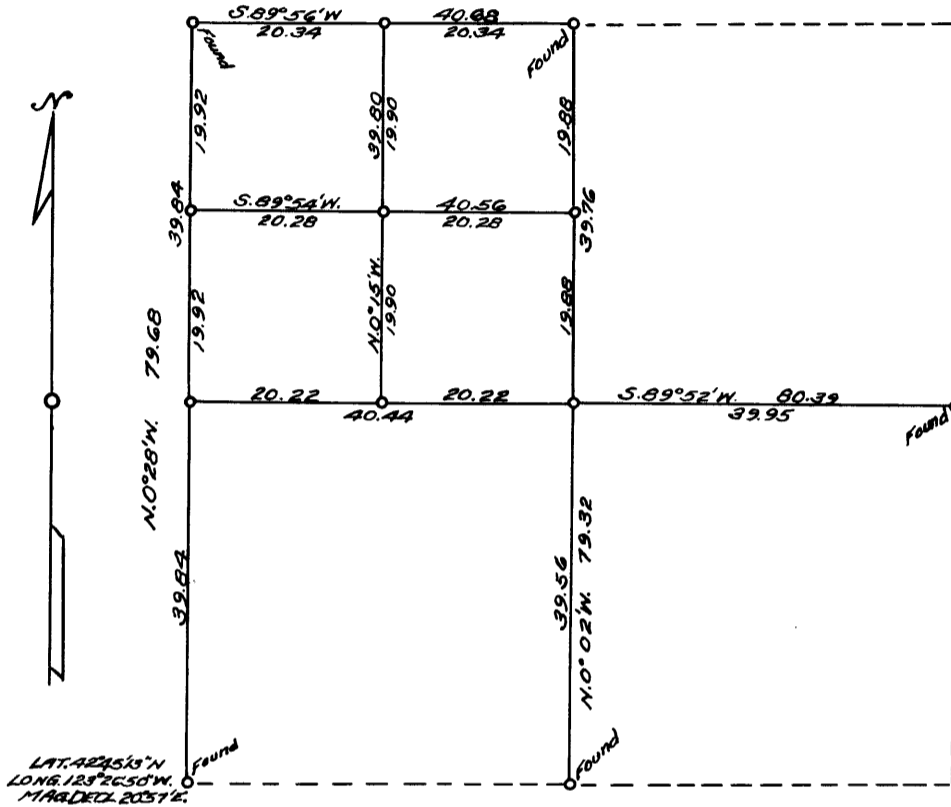

## Dependent Resurvey of Part of Bdrs. of Section 29

## Chains

The cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31, and 32 is monumented with an iron rod,  $\frac{3}{4}$  in. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone; this corner is locally used and accepted but there is no remaining evidence of the original corner monument.

At the corner point over the iron rod,

Set an iron pipe, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, mkd. RS33; and mark new bearing trees as follows:

A madrona, 6 ins. diam., bears N.39°E., 73 lks.  
dist., mkd. T32S R6W S29 RS33 BT.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.8°E., 38 lks.  
dist., mkd. T32 S R6W S32 RS33 BT.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S.64°W., 24 lks.  
dist., mkd. T32S R6W S31 RS33 BT.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.67°W., 29 lks.  
dist., mkd. T32S R6W S30 RS33 BT.

The geographic position of this corner is latitude 42°45'13"N., and longitude 123°26'50"W. The observed magnetic declination is 20°57'E.

Nov. 18, 1954: at this sec. cor. at 9 a.m., app.t., or 9h1m09s a.m. by my watch which reads correct 120th meridian time, I set off 42°45'N., on the lat. arc., 19°10 $\frac{1}{4}$ 'S., on the decl. arc. of my Gurley solar compass and determine a meridian with the solar attachment which is in perfect adjustment. Further solar observations were taken at each station along each line or the alignment was carried forward by double back and foresight method with a fully equipped engineer's transit.

- 39.84 Point for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 30 at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.13°E., 32 lks.  
dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S29 RS33 BT.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.45°W., 19 lks.  
dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S30 RS33 BT.

- 59.76 Point for N. 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 30 at proportionate distance.

Set an iron pipe, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, mkd. RS33; from which

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.65°E., 31 lks.  
dist., mkd. N 1/16 S29 RS33 BT.

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S.14°W., 24 lks.  
dist., mkd. N 1/16 S30 RS33 BT.

- 79.68 The locally recognized and accepted cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30 at corner of burned fences extending N., E., and S. The fence corner post is marked with incomplete burned scribe marks. There is no evidence of the original corner monument. I accept this position as the most acceptable evidence of the original corner.

A chinquapin, 6 ins. diam., bears S.48°W., 30 lks.  
dist., mkd. T32S R6W S30 RS33 BT.

A madrona, 6 ins. diam., bears N.38½°W., 42 lks.  
dist., mkd. T32S R6W S19 RS33 BT.

Against E. side of fence corner post, set an iron pipe, 3  
ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, mkd. RS33.

The point for ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 20 and 29 is determined  
at the record bearing and distance from both old bearing  
trees.

At the corner point,

Set an iron pipe, 3 ft. long, 1½ ins. diam., 28 ins. in the  
ground, mkd. RS33; from which the original bearing trees:

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.80°E., 48 lks.  
dist., with blaze burnt.

A madrona, 18 ins. diam., bears S.54°E., 18 lks.  
dist., with blaze decayed.

And new bearing trees:

An incense cedar, 14 ins. diam., bears N.17°E., 76 lks.  
dist., mkd. ¼ S20 RS33 BT.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.23°E., 46 lks.  
dist., mkd. ¼ S29 RS33 BT.

Thence

S. 89° 56' W., bet. secs. 20 and 29.

20.34 Point for W. 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 20 and 29 at propor-  
tionate distance.

Set an iron pipe, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the  
ground, mkd. RS33; from which

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.11°W., 54 lks.  
dist., mkd. W 1/16 S20 RS33 BT.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.43°E., 22 lks.  
dist., mkd. W 1/16 S29 RS33 BT.

40.68 The cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30.

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 32 is monumented with a  
black oak post, 4 ins. square, 15 ins. above ground,  
firmly set, mkd. ¼ S29 on N., T32S R6W on E., S32 on S.,  
and 2807 on W. side; from which

A black oak, 12 ins. diam., bears N.21½°E., 20 lks.  
dist., mkd. ¼ S29 2807 BT.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.20°E., 25 lks.  
dist., mkd. ¼ S32 2807 BT.

Thence

N. 0° 02' W., on N. and S. center line of sec. 29.

T. 32 S., R. 6 W.

39.56 Point for center  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 29 at intersection with the E. and W. center line.

Set an iron pipe, 3 ft. long,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, mkd. RS33; from which

A madrona, 8 ins. diam., bears N.46 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 51 lks. dist., mkd. C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S29 RS33 BT.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.36 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 18 lks. dist., mkd. C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S29 RS33 BT.

59.44 Point for center N. 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 29.

Set an iron pipe, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, mkd. RS33; from which

A madrona, 12 ins. diam., bears S.86°E., 8 lks. dist., mkd. CN 1/16 S29 RS33 BT.

A madrona, 14 ins. diam., bears S.25°W., 16 lks. dist., mkd. CN 1/16 S29 RS33 BT.

79.32 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 20 and 29.

The locus of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 28 and 29 is determined at the record bearing and distance from each old original bearing tree.

At the corner point,

Set an iron pipe, 3 ft. long,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, mkd. RS33; from which the original bearing trees:

The badly decayed stump of a black oak bears N.89°E., 56 lks. dist.

An incense cedar, 28 ins. diam., bears S.66°W., 57 lks. dist., with partial scribe marks on charred face of old blaze.

And new bearing trees:

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.38°E., 18 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S28 RS33 BT.

A chinquapin, 6 ins. diam., bears S.28°W., 49 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S29 RS33 BT.

S. 89° 52' W., on E. and W. center line of sec. 29.

39.95 The center  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 29 at intersection with the N. and S. center line.

60.17 Point for center W. 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 29.

Set an iron pipe, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, mkd. RS33; from which

An incense cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N.44°E., 65 lks. dist., mkd. CW 1/16 S29 RS33 BT.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.7°W., 45 lks. dist., mkd. CW 1/16 S29 RS33 BT.

80.39 The  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 30.

Subdivision of NW.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 29.

From the center W. 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 29

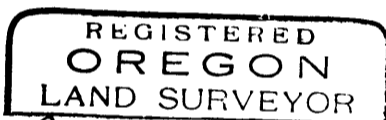

- A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.  $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E., 95 lks. dist. ✓  
mkd. NW  $\frac{1}{16}$  S29 RS33 BT.
- A madrona, 10 ins. diam., bears S.  $4^{\circ}$  W., 11 lks. dist., mkd. NW  $\frac{1}{16}$  S29 RS33 BT.
- 39.80 The W.  $\frac{1}{16}$  sec. cor. of secs. 20 and 29.
- From the center N.  $\frac{1}{16}$  sec. cor. of sec. 29
- S.  $89^{\circ} 54'$  W., on E. and W. center line of NW.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of sec. 29.
- 20.28 The NW.  $\frac{1}{16}$  sec. cor. of sec. 29 at intersection with the the N. and S. center line.
- 40.56 The N.  $\frac{1}{16}$  sec. cor. of secs. 29 and 30.

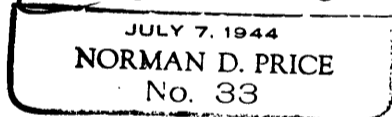
