FOUND REMAINS OF DRIF. B.T. S 18 1/2° W 37.6 FT. AXE MARKS & PART OF OLD FACE VISIBLE. NO SCRIBING VISIBLE.

FOUND OAK, UPROOTED & DOWN, WITH FACE CHOPPED OPEN. CENTER PORTION ENTIRELY ROTTED AWAY. THE STUMP HOLE FOR THIS TREE IS N 87° W 28.4 FT. FROM CORNER.

FOUND BLACK OAK, NOW 20" DIAM., S 32 3/4° E 38.9 FT. THIS TREE HAS BEEN CHOPPED OPEN & CENTER PORTION IS ENTIRELY ROTTED AWAY.

FOUND FIR, NOW 42" DIAM., S 42 1/2° W 50.8 FT. THIS TREE HAS BEEN CHOPPED OPEN & THE FACE BADLY CHARRED, BUT FAINT TRACES OF SCRIBING ARE VISIBLE - NO LETTERS OR NUMBERS LEGIBLE.
