I set an oak post S 72° W 47 lks. from the N.E. oak and N 12° W 91 lks. from  
the S.E. oak and marked post C.S. from which I marked new

A W. oak 36" S 64° 25' W 165 lks.

Found S.W. fir and cheped into figures - and marked C.S.B.T. on stump and  
C.S. above the opening - from sd. S.W. fir measured N 43 E 52 lks. and set a  
cedar post from which I marked new  
a fir 30" N 8° W 45 lks. marked C.S.B.T.  
" " 16" S 80° E 65 " " " " " "

The N.W. black oak wit. tree is gone and the stump shows the position of the  
tree which corresponds for direction and bearing. The S.E. fir has blown  
down and the N.E. white oak is gone.
