Re-entering angle of the James A. Wallace D.L.C. No. 40 in T 18 SR 2 W  
 Found post and pile of rocks mentioned in county survey records lost entirely. The ash 18" diam. bearing S 18° W 3.18 chs remains but all marks are gone; also the stool of the ash 8 ins. diam. bearing S 45 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E 1.86 chs. remains with one younger tree growing from it. These trees are remembered by the old residents to be the old bearing trees.
