Dear Sir:

Reference is made to the Northeast corner of Section 7, T. 33 S., R. 6 W., Will Mer, Douglas County, Oregon.

This corner is located approximately one mile southwest of Glendale, Oregon, in the Section Creek drainage.

W. H. Byars survey of 1882 lists the following trees witnessing this corner:

4" Vine Maple	N 80° E	18 Lks.
14" Alder	N 15° W	100 Lks.
14" Madrone	S 10° W	10 Lks.
8" Chinquapin	S 60° E	18 Lks.

In connection with a Bureau of Land Management timber sale road project and easements connected therewith, this corner is an essential control point.

During the course of the road survey, at the approximate corner location as determined from topographic maps and aerial photos, a point was found from which the following objects are located:

Vine Maple root cluster	N 80° E	10 Lks.
19" Alder (Approx. 40 yrs.)	N 15° W	97 Lks.
Rotten Madrone stump	S 10° W	10 Lks.

The madrone stump has been dead for an appreciable length of time. At the foot thereof a piece of outer shell was recovered with an axe backed "X" partially healed over on the convex outer surface. On the concave surface appears to be a reverse scribe "S".

The Alder does not appear to be old enough to have been a 14" tree in 1882 as evidenced by present size and growth rings. However another axe hacked "X" was found thereon.

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In view of the importance of this corner to our road survey and future management plans in Section 7, we would appreciate your examination of the evidence of the above described corner for reestablishment and perpetuation.

Your prompt attention to this matter will be appreciated, and upon notification this office will be happy to furnish a man to guide you to the specific location.
