The FIR to ME. That was apparently used as the CRIP. BT. by MR. KIBSON in 1957 may have been accepted from the SCOP plans - We opened approx 90 to 100 years of ring growth & failed to find scribe or Bull wood. The scar at 2 o'clock appears to be a cut, but I feel after a close inspection that it is an injury rather than an axe blow. It is possible that MR. KIBSON Ed. something not visible now - in view of the lack of evidence at this time & because there is an FIR set - we cannot set BRASS cap or MARK NEW BT'S -
