This section corner was identified and referenced by Glen McChesney July 29, 1958, and referenced this date 12/16/69 with two new references. Below is the record and current status of this corner.

13" Cedar N68°E 30 Lks. 19.8'

In 1958 found down rotted cedar N69°E 20.0' to root hole; not now identifiable.

8" Cedar S60°E 15 Lks. 9.9'

Not found in 1959 - "Destroyed by Cat".

15" Cedar S60°W 30 Lks. 19.8'

In 1958 found 30" cedar, face not opened, S64°W 19.8'. Now down long butt on root, moved out of position by road building and logging.

16" Fir N46°W 88 Lks. 58.1'

In 1958 found standing 28" Fir, scribing visible, N43°W 58.1', same status this date.

GLO Survey Record - 1959

Found Weyerhaeuser Company iron pipe set at record bearing & distance from each of the two remaining original bearing trees. Also found & scribed two Weyerhaeuser Company bearing trees:

10" Hemlock N37°E 17 Lks.

12" Cedar S73°E 41 Lks.

Set iron post with brass cap at the corner point and deposited the iron pipe alongside.

Present Condition: 12/16/69

Now dead 14" Hemlock, plate and "W" nail visible and GLO 1959 scribing visible.

Now dead 12" Incense Cedar, plate and "W" nail visible and GLO 1959 scribing visible.

Down long butt out of position.

Turned up stump and root of original BT, plate "W" nail, and original scribing visible.
