SMALL, SQUARED WOOD STAKE NEAR TWO LARGE TREES WHICH WERE NOT CUT IN LOGGING OPERATIONS. THESE TREES HAVE APPARENTLY BEEN USED AS ORIGINAL BEARING TREES IN THE PAST. WE FIND NO SCRIBING ON THE APPARENT NW O.B.T.; AN APPROX. 52" D. FIR SNAG. THE APPARENT SE O.B.T., AN APPROX 52" D. FIR, NOW DOWN, HAS A VERY CLEAR BARK SCRIBE " $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT" WITH THE SCRIBE PIVOT POINT HOLE STILL PLAINLY VISIBLE ON SOME LETTERS.

OUR FINDING OF SCRIBING ON THE SE TREE AND NO. MARKINGS ON THE NW TREE IS CONTRARY TO THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN REN. # 105. IT IS ALSO INCONSISTENT WITH INFORMATION SHOWN ON THE CORNER

FURTHERMORE, RECORDED BEARINGS AND
DISTANCES FROM THESE APPARENT BT'S
PLACE THE CORNER POINT APPROX. 3 FT
NW OF THE PRESENT LOCATION OF THE
SQUARED WOOD STAKE.

THIS POSSIBLE CORNER LOCATION FALLS
ON AN E-W CUTTING LINE, BOTH APPARENT
BT'S HAVE BEEN TAGGED PREVIOUSLY, AND
THERE ARE SEVERAL CRUISERS INITIALS CHOPPED
IN THE APPARENT BT'S AND NEARBY TREES.

THEREFORE, BASED ON THE DISCREPANCIES
NOTED CONCERNING THE MARKINGS FOUND
AND NOT FOUND ON THE NW TREE AND
THE APPARENT YOUNG AGE OF THE SCRIBE
FOUND ON THE SE TREE, WE DO NOT
FEEL WE HAVE SUFFICIENT EVIDENCE TO
MONUMENT THE CORNER AT THIS TIME.
