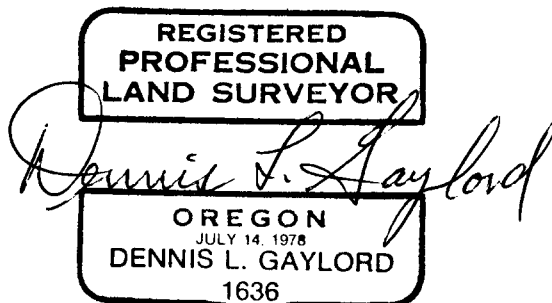
Purpose: To monument a portion of the right-of-way granted to the U.S. Government. (See Volume 211, Page 275, Douglas County Records).

Procedure: The survey was performed with a Ziess Th-43 Theodolite, A Mac 1E E.D.M. and a 200 foot steel chain. The distances to the H.E. S. corners called in the deed are used without change. Since line 7 - 8 of H.E.S. 143 was found to be very close to the original record, the width called in the deed for this end of the R/W parcel is used without change. The width of R/W parcel on line 8 & 9 of H.E.S. 143 was adjusted to make the right-of-way limits parallel. (The original intent of the R/W deed).
