I visited the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner between Sections 1 & 6 on the Range Line between T. 28 S., R. 8 W. and R. 9 W. on March 23, 1982 and found the following:

A chinquapin 12" in diameter bears S. 70 degrees E. 36 links (now a 15' rotting snag with scribing clearly visible inside). *(200 Links)*

A chinquapin 12" in diameter bears S. 85 degrees W. 23 links (scribing visible but very badly rotting log on the ground). *(25 Links)*

I marked two new BT's:

A fir 7 inches in diameter bears N. 4 degrees E. 9.1 feet, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. BT

A fir 8 inches in diameter bears S. 89 degrees 30' W. 4.2 feet, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. BT

These trees also have a PK nail in them at the blaze with the letter W on them, and each BT is painted red, has a BLM tag attached, a Weyerhaeuser tag attached and are also ribboned.

A third Weyerhaeuser marked tree has been cut down and was a 10 inch hemlock bearing N. 57 degrees E. 39.0 feet with tag and PK nail.

I also visited the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner common to Sections 6 & 7 of T. 28 S., R. 8 W. and found that the original fir Bearing Tree had fallen down and the bole subsequently logged. The two new bearing trees that Byron marked were in poor shape because the chinquapin rotted completely away, and the blazes and marks on the yew tree were burned out due to the slash fire. Therefore, from the existing Douglas County brass cap I marked the following trees for BT's: *(957)*

A yew 16 inches in diameter bears S. 49 degrees E. 20.2 feet, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. BT (using old burned out blazes).

A chinquapin 14 inches in diameter bears N. 32 degrees 15 feet W. 34.0 feet, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. BT.

Trees are painted red and marked with BLM BT tags.
