FINAL FILING

The purpose of the survey was to establish a new centerline for reconstruction of the Pacific Highway through the subject section. In connection with this survey, additional highway right-of-way was established and the highway centerline was referenced and monumented.

The original survey for this new section was a 1967 survey done by the Oregon State Highway Division.

Bearings, co-ordinates and distances for ground control were established from ties made by occupying Wards 2 (USC&GS) triangulation station and turning angles from Wards 2 Azimuth Mark and Spencer (1903).

A resurvey was accomplished in 1976 by the OSHD and was tied into the 1967 survey. The 1976 survey was then later monumented after construction of this highway portion and monumentation was completed in 1982.

An intermediate filing covering centerline monumentation set on the project has been previously submitted.

Due to this map being an update of older mapping and surveys, some shown monumentation does not have ties. This is in agreement with an understanding between OSHD and the county surveyors made in 1978.

This survey was conducted in Section 9, 10, 15, 16, 17 and 20, T. 21 S, R. 4 W, W.M.
