Sketch of Monument, Accessories, and General Area

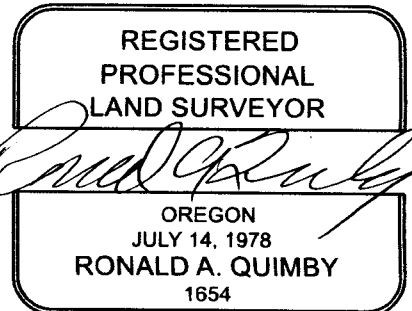

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, madrone, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, Oregon grape, vine maple, rhododendron, poison oak, and fern.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 32, monumented with the original basalt stone, 18 x 10 x 8 ins., loosely set 6 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1 ft. high, mkd. 1/4 on W. face, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:

A root hole, bears N. 52° E., 44 lks. dist., with a down chinquapin alongside, size indeterminate, no marks visible.

and the remains of a bearing tree of which I have no record

A fir snag, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 4 1/2° W., 74 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open and burned blaze.
