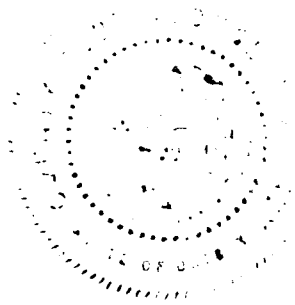
NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that at a special election held on April 24, 1953, for the purpose of voting on the creation of a livestock district to be known as the Galesville Livestock District in Douglas County, Oregon, a majority of all the legal votes cast in said election favored the creation of said livestock district; that the boundaries of the aforementioned district in Douglas County, Oregon, are as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at N.W. corner of Section 19, Twp. 31 S., Range 3 W.; thence West 5 miles; South 3 1/2 miles, West 3/4 mile; South 1/2 mile; East 3/4 mile; South 1 mile; East 3 miles; South to the county line; easterly along county line to a point directly South of the place of beginning; North to S.E. corner Section 1 Twp. 32 S., Range 4 W.; West 2 miles; North 1 mile; East 1 mile; North 1 mile; East 1 mile; North 2 miles to place of beginning.

That on or after the sixtieth (60th) day from the date of the first publication of this notice, it shall be unlawful for livestock to run at large within the boundaries of the above described livestock district, which shall be known as the Galesville Livestock District; that said livestock district is created pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 513, Oregon Laws of 1949. Section 9 of said Act makes it a misdemeanor for any person owning or having the custody, possession or control of any livestock who shall herd or permit any such livestock to run or be at large within a livestock district.
