NOTICE OF CREATION OF DREW LIVESTOCK DISTRICT

Whereas, on the 21st day of May, 1954, an election was held in Tiller Precinct, Douglas County, Oregon, for the creation of a livestock district to be known as Drew Livestock District, described as follows; to-wit:

"An area one mile in width, extending one-half mile on either side of the center line of the Tiller-Trail State Highway No. 227 from a point on the east line of Section 10, Township 31 South, Range 2 West, Willamette Meridian, and extending in a general South-easterly direction following the course of said highway through Sections 10, 11, 14, 13 and 24 in said Township and Range, and thence through Sections 19 and 29 of Township 31 South, Range 1, West, Willamette Meridian, to a point on the South line of said Section 29, all in Douglas County, Oregon."

and at said election a majority of all votes cast at said election in said district were in favor of creation of said livestock district.

Therefore, notice is hereby given that on and after the sixtieth day from the date of the first publication of this notice it shall be unlawful for livestock to run at large within the boundaries of said livestock district.

Any person owning or having the custody, possession or control of any livestock, namely, any bovine species, horses, mules, asses, sheep, goats and swine, who shall herd or permit any such livestock to run at large therein shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and Justice, District and Circuit Courts shall have concurrent jurisdiction of actions for the prosecution of such misdemeanors.
