PROCLAMATION

Pursuant to ORS 607.040, I Chas. Doerner, County Clerk of Douglas County, State of Oregon, do hereby give notice, that at the general election held November 6, 1956, at the regular voting place for the South Drain voting precinct an election was held pursuant to Oregon Law for the establishment of a livestock control district to be known as the Sunnysdale Livestock Control District within the following described area, to-wit:

"Beginning at the intersection of the east section line of Section 15, Township 22 South, Range 6 West, W.M., and the center line of Oregon State Highway No. 38; thence running southerly along the east section line of said Section 15 to the Southeast corner of said Section 15; thence running westerly along the south section lines of Sections 15, 16 and 17, Township 22 South, Range 6 West, W.M., to the Southwest corner of said Section 17; thence running northerly along the west section line of Sections 17 and 8, Township 22 South, Range 6 West, W.M., to the center line of Oregon State Highway No. 38; thence running easterly along said center line of Oregon State Highway No. 38 to the place of beginning. All in Douglas County, State of Oregon."

And, whereas at such election 12 persons voted to prohibit livestock from running at large in the above area and 7 persons voted against prohibiting livestock from running at large therein:

Notice is hereby given that on and after the sixtieth day from the date of the first publication of this notice no person owning or having the custody, possession or control of any livestock shall herd or permit such livestock to run or be at large in any of the above described area.

"Livestock" as defined by this act means Cattle of the bovine species, Horses, Mules, Asses, Sheep, Goats and Swine.

Justice, district, and circuit courts have concurrent jurisdiction of actions for the prosecution of violations of this section.
