I began the survey at the  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. bet. secs. 28 and 29 above tp. and rp. I note this corner is a large rock and was estab. by Sur. Germond as noted in the records. I call this  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. point "A". From this point "A" I run a true line by a sun observation N.00°-06' W. a distance of approximately (no measurement made) to point "B" or the N.E. Cor. of D.L.C. No. 37 I set in for the N.E. cor. of Cl. 37 a 2" X 30" cast iron pipe. From this point "B" I turn and run S.89°-47' W. a dist. of 44.81 to point "C" or the "L" Cor. of claim 37. I identify this cor, from the maple and fir B.T.S. and from the testimony of Dennis Hanks who was present and certified to the fact that he had seen the Gov. figures on maple and fir. I also, in order to prove the location of point "C" run a random line north a distance of 15.50 and find one of the old bearing trees at this point, which proves Hanks is correct. I then return and estab. point "C" or the "L" Cor. by setting a 2" X 36" G.I.P. from which an alder 12" dia, brs. S.62 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° East, 74 lks dist.

A new Gurley transit was usee on the work. The work was done by the use of true lines estab. by sun observations. The chaining was performed by inexperienced workmen.
