Purpose of	survey was to get S.E. Cor. of D.L.C. 38 and part of lines N. and W. from said corner.	Purpose of	

F.B. 14 = 45 R

Began the survey at the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. on the south side of sec. 32 above tp. & rg. I locate $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. from one old B.T. (spruce) and note that hemlock tree is rotten. I set in and marked a 6" x 48" stake for $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. and remarked old B.T. Thence East by needle

7.08 to a point and set in a temp. stake "A" Th. N. 22°-00' E. by needle

4.75 to a point and set in temp. stake "B" for S.E. Cor. of Nat. Schofield D.L.C. I make very diligent search here for old cor. marks but could find none. Th. I continue line on N. 22°-00' E. by needle and at a new dist. of

0.75 I cross small stream, C. N.W. and at a dist. of

16.82 from stake "B" I set in temp. stake "C" 4" x 48" for the intersection of the 1/16 sec. line with my line.

I then return to temp. cor. "B" and run N. 71°-00' W. and at

1.50 I pass S. of an old tree marked with a blaze/^{made} 60 yrs. or more ago. Again I made a diligent search here for the old cor. to the Schofield claim and find good evidence of the witness trees of the old cor. viz.,

1st. 40" sp. with bearing blaze and 3 notches underneath-- but no scribe marks altho. blaze and notches very plain. Blaze and notches show age 48 lks. of 60 yrs. or more. The spruce bears N. 22° East from point set as given in old notes.

2nd. 48" sp. with bearing blaze. The blaze had been cut out long ago and all marks were obliterated. This sp. brs. N. 71° W. /fr. pt. set in 1st. arg'm't. 32 lks.

3rd. 3 spruce in clump. The one facing the cor. pt. as located in arguments one and two was rotted and almost gone, However it was easy to ascertain its location and I note that it bore S. 71° E. 72 lks. Therefore from this evidence, which agree very closely to the facts set forth in the old notes I hold I have found the position of the old obliterated D.C. Cor. and established the same by setting a 5" x 48" sp. stake. ^{and M.K. Cl. 38 on same} This new cor. is set so it agrees in bearing and distances as set forth in arguments 1-2 and 3. I also note that this new S.E. Cor. of Cl. No. 38 is 2.00 chs. west of Temp. cor. "B". I call this new D.C. Cor. "D" and from "D" I run a line N. 71° W.

7.50 and set stake, which I call stake "E". From stake "E" I run south to the $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. on the south side of section 32, or the cor. at which I began the survey.

I discontinued the work here at the request of Mr. Jones. He expressed himself as being satisfied with the work done.

New Gurley transit used. All needle work on account of the foggy weather. m. Stratton and E.B. Bradford chmen. Work was well performed.
