I went to the quarter corner between sections 5 and 6, as set by County Surveyor Frank Cain and recorded I found a 6" Squared stake set for corner with two witness trees properly scribed, which checked with Cain's record I also found the Laurel stub that was the corner, as called for in the Government Field Notes, and the Original Laurel witness tree From this corner I ran a tacked transit line to the Northeast corner section 6 where I found a squared stake properly witnessed and recorded This corner was also set by Frank Cain and the bearing trees checked out correctly for distance

From the traverse as run I compute the length of the line from the quarter corner to the section corner as being N 1°39'E 2526.3 feet, variation 21°15' E. No sun for solar observation I compute offsets from marks set on the traverse line and run a line on the true line connecting these two corners and this line cuts thru house, 26 feet from front of porch The barn, pig pen, granary and chicken house are also East of the true line

The line was carefully run, using a 300 ft steel tape and I held the rear end of tape at instrument head and read the vertical angle to the station ahead One triangulation used, distance of base line and the included angles being read twice to avoid mistakes W S Crearer, chairman, Jack Huber rear flag man, Weather cloudy
