Owing to the fact that several of the Deed Descriptions of the property at present owned by E. H. Ottinger did not close and that the tie lines were such that the property could not be identified a survey for new descriptions was requested.

I commenced the survey at the  $\frac{1}{4}$  section corner between sections 7 and 12 T 26 S R 5 and 6 W which was the NW corner of the property in question. I then ran easterly on the North line of the Willis Jenkins D.C. (the NE corner of which I located previously) to its intersection with the county road, formally known as the Old Military Road, thence following said road and the old fence lines tying in all points which could be identified as points on the old deed descriptions of this and adjoining property and back to the point of beginning.

On account of these old fence lines existing undisputed for more than 40 years, Mr Ottinger having owned the property since 1891 the lines were ~~marked~~ as being the true lines. Sufficient old points were found and several of the old bearing and distances were identified which proved that the fences enclosed the lands which ~~the~~ the old deeds had intended to convey.

The field notes are filed in vault 22 envelope ~~10~~ which also contain the computation sheets and new descriptions.
