4" Fir N 70° W 142 ft; a 4" Fir S 76° E 198 ft.

1/4 Cor. bet. Secs 4-5

Found a sandstone marked 1/4 5 CS from which a Fir 10" S 21° W 144 ft. A Fir 12" N 24° 30' E 135 ft
Stump of 24" Fir no scribe marks visible bears N 72° E 629 ft. no trace of other Goot BT.
I believe this corner was renewed by M B Germond but not recorded.

1/4 Cor. N boundary Sec 4

Renewed this corner from stump of large W. Oak N 51° W 229 lbs and Fir stump S 55° W 405 lbs both stumps badly decayed. Fence corner 15 ft south and 10 ft west.

Set an iron pipe 1" x 36 from which I mark
a W. Oak 10" dia S 50° 50' W 147 ft
a Fir 30 N 47° W 668 ft.

1/4 Corner bet. Secs 3-4

Renewed this corner at a point where I found a fir stake marked 1/4 5 CS presumably set by Germond.
from which a fir 30" dia (chopped open by Germond but scribe marks visible at this time) bears N 45° W 932 ft.
no trace of other BT. I marked a
Fir 12" S 5° 00' E 170 ft. 1/4 5 CS BT

1/4 corner 28-29 set stake from old wit trees one down with marks other standing marks gone. Marked New Trees
